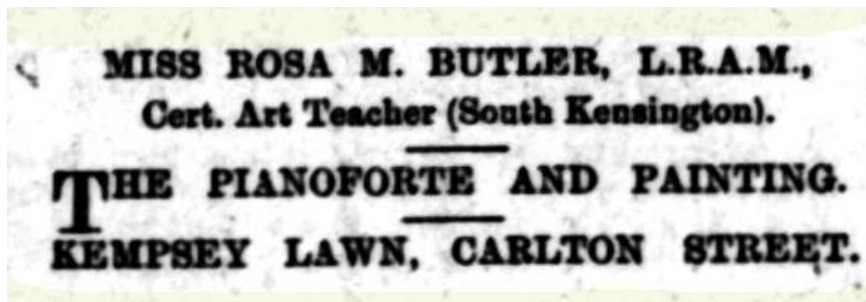
1901 Census

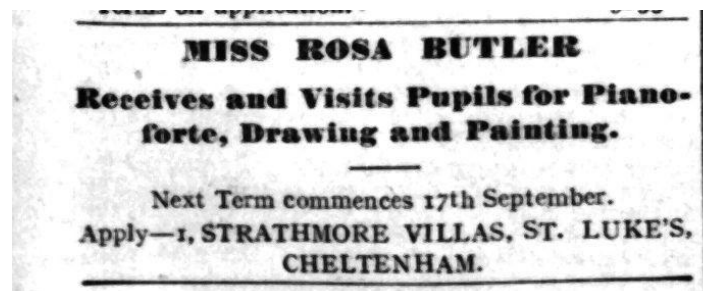
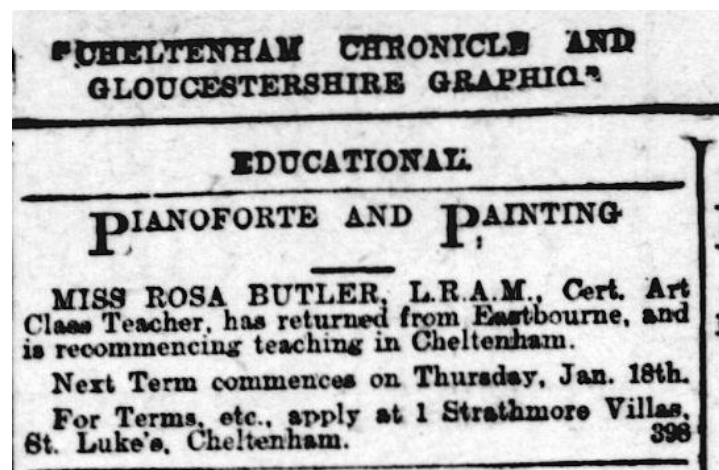
